Welcome to the first of our quarterly Newsletters of the 'VSG PPG' – 'The Village Surgeries Group (Tattenhall & Farndon) - Patient Participation Group'. Following a series of initial meetings, our PPG was officially formed on 12 September and comprises a group of key committee members who will meet on a regular basis. In addition, a wider group of approximately 50 patients who attended the inaugural meetings also expressed an interest in the PPG. Their future participation will be very much appreciated. Any patient registered at the practice can become involved with the PPG and our hope is that together we will become a strong voice, not only on local surgery issues, but importantly, in the context of rural Cheshire too. In 2018 we intend to hold wider public meetings to ensure all patients are aware of our progress and to ensure inclusivity for everyone.

Our role as a PPG is to be a 'critical friend' to the VSG.

Advise the VSG on the patient perspective and provide insight into the responsiveness and quality of services.

Encourage patients to take greater responsibility for their own and their family's health.

Carry out surveys into the views of those who use the VSG and to report back on these findings.

Organise health promotion events and improve health literacy. Provide regular updates and communication with the VSG and the wider patient population. An initial task will be to undertake a Patient Survey; accessible in print and electronic formats. This is a first stepping stone in obtaining vital information and a clear understanding of your views regarding the VSG. In turn, this will equip us for future needs and provide a positive voice within our communities. The PPG can also be pivotal in ensuring future funding for the VSG and, supported by positive, focused individuals, it is anticipated that the group can go from strength to strength. If you are no longer taking medication that is still on your repeat slip, or which is being ordered unnecessarily on your behalf, please contact the surgery so that they can delete it from your repeat medication list. Please also check with any elderly relatives and if they have unnecessary stored medication or medication which may be out-of-date, then please return those items to your Pharmacy for safe disposal. NEVER flush unused or unwanted medicines down the toilet.

IMPORTANT ANTIBIOTICS INFO

Antibiotics are important medicines for treating bacterial infections. However bacteria can adapt and find ways to survive the effects of an antibiotic. Antibiotic resistance is one of the most significant threats to patient safety. To slow down the development of antibiotic resistance it is important to take antibiotics as prescribed and always complete the course. If your GP does not prescribe an antibiotic for you, there is always a good reason for that.

PRACTICE NEWS – E-Consult

E-Consult is an online patient triage system for non-urgent medical problems which was introduced on 1 November. This system allows patients to access self-care advice and gives signposting to specific local services e.g. pharmacy first or symptoms will be triaged for a GP appointment/telephone consultation and/or prescription if required.

Patients must be 18 years and over and registered at the practice to use this service. www.thevillagesurgeriesgroup.co.uk
